SAUK COUNTY OPEN CLASS FAIR GENERAL RULES

1. Boys and girls in FFA, 4-H, or FHA are not permitted to exhibit in Open Class and Junior Fair. Other youth 3rd grade or above may show in open class but not when eligible for Junior Fair.
2. Open Class entries should be entered online, starting May 1st follow the link at <http://saukcountyfair.com/> (Exhibitor Tab-Open Class) OR alternatively can be mailed to: Sauk County Ag Society, Attn: Secretary, PO Box 467, Baraboo, WI 53913. Any entries whether entered online or postmarked must be entered on or before June 1st, 2017. Choose online entry for a quick and error free experience- directions below. You can send the check, read below.

Directions for Online Entry ONLINE Entry is the preferred entry method, and results in less errors and inconveniences to you.

If you prefer to send in payment, you may put code 9999 in the payment field at check out and send in payment to the Secretary at the address above.

Online entries will be accepted starting May 1st, 2017 Go to the Sauk County Fair website- <http://saukcountyfair.com/> Follow the Exhibitor link to Open Class Fair on the home page.

Follow the link titled BLUE RIBBON OPEN CLASS FAIR ONLINE ENTRY. This will take you to the Blue Ribbon online entry site for Sauk County Open Class.

Create an account. Choose your entries, pay appropriate fees, or send a check for entries. Choose the correct fee schedule depending on the number of entries you have. Choose the fee for the correct range of entries (ie: 1-10, 11-20 etc.) Incorrect fees may cause your entry to be denied. The convenience fee charge for online entries is \$2/exhibitor.

3. ABSOLUTELY NO Late entries will be accepted after June 1st, 2016
4. Sauk County Ag Society Members can pick up a season parking permit at the Secretary's office on Wednesday of the fair. Any day after Wed. the permit must be purchased at the gate and reimbursements will be made at the office.
5. **** Reminder **** Each Sauk County Ag Society Member may **no longer** enter exhibits for no charge. For each 10 entries or less, whether entered on the entry form, or online requires the \$5.00 entry fee.
6. All open class exhibitors other than, Department 64 - Nursing Home and CBRF classes, must fill out an entry form for entries submitted by mail, at a cost of \$5 per form of 10 entries or less. An exhibitor may make up to 10 entries for each \$5 fee. Find form on the back cover of this booklet. Enclose appropriate entry fee's with all mailed in entries. Your 11th through 20th entries require a second entry form, thus you must also pay an additional \$5 for the second form and so on. An exhibitor may

- copy as many entry forms as needed. Each full or partial entry form requires a \$5 entry fee. Each 10 or less online entries require a \$5 fee. Entries open to Sauk County residents only.
7. Department 64-Nursing Home/CBRF classes must fill out an entry form or enter online. There is no fee for this department and no premiums are paid, ribbons only.
8. When returning your completed exhibitor entry form, be careful to print plainly. Each item entered must be fully listed on the ticket, including department number, class number, and entry number of the individual exhibit and description of item. All animal entries must have an animal ID, Farm premises ID, and animal name entered. All entry forms must be signed.
9. No premium awarded if an item is not listed in this book or on your entry form. No premium on inferior exhibits.
10. Items winning premiums at previous Sauk County fairs are not eligible this year.
11. Each exhibitor may enter only ONE item per Entry Number. **The exhibitor may not compete against themselves in an entry number.**
12. All entries are straight judged with placing 1st through 4th.
13. Wednesday is ENTRY DAY.
14. Buildings will be ready for exhibits at 9 a.m.
15. All exhibits must be in place by 6 p.m. The department or building superintendent will open the building at 9 a.m. and will be on duty throughout the day. Someone will supervise buildings whenever they are open to the public.
16. NO exhibits can be removed before Sunday at 4 p.m. without consent of Fair officials. ANY VIOLATION WILL BE CAUSE FOR WITHHOLDING PREMIUMS.
17. Dogs will NOT be allowed on the grounds or in the barns, except for service dogs.
18. Season parking tickets may be purchased at the gate or Fair office for \$20.
19. All entries will be judged on Thursday.
20. **Effective 2015 – ALL EXHIBITORS MUST BE 3RD GRADE OR OLDER, AS OF TIME OF ENTRY TO EXHIBIT IN OPEN CLASS.**
21. Animal entries are only allowed for Junior Fair Participants.
