Guests from around Sauk County and beyond enjoyed a little soggy weather, food, rides, activities and a wide selection of events during the week of July 10th-16th, 2023, at the Sauk County Fair in Baraboo, Wisconsin. The spring and summer of 2023 had been particularly dry for the area farmers and, Wednesday, the first day the animals, midway, vendors and buildings were open brought rain

to the grounds! Not a sad face was seen as fairgoers put on their boots, grabbed an umbrella, and headed out to the fair. In fact, a lot of smiles were seen by almost everyone.
