REQUIREMENTS:

- Members must furnish feed, bedding and necessary equipment.
- Cattle under quarantine by DATCP are not eligible for exhibition.
- The superintendent will do check in of cattle from 10 AM – 3:00 PM in Progress Hall for any cattle ready and in place to check in.
- Report any animals that were left at home for any reason to the superintendent.

REGISTERED CATTLE

1. A managerial animal is an animal that is under the daily care of but not owned by the exhibitor.
2. Exhibiting of managerial animals in the Junior Division is open to all dairy exhibitors - regardless of age of animal.
3. All registration certificates for all bovine must be presented to the superintendent by 8AM on the day of the show or cattle will be shown in the grade classes. Telegrams, telephone calls, faxes and other communications from breed association certifying applications for registration will not be accepted.
4. Ownership by a junior exhibitor is established when an animal is recorded in the name of the junior exhibitor only.
5. "Ownership of all calves and yearlings must be owned or transferred to the exhibitor's name on or before MAY 1 of the year in which the animal is exhibited. For any animal that is 2 years and older or has calved at least once, the ownership or transfer date must be before Jan. 1st of the show year to be eligible for State Fair."
6. Registered two (2) year old and older cows may be shown in the registered class even if it is not in the exhibitor's name. However, if the animal is to be exhibited at the Wisconsin State Fair, then rule 4 applies. This applies to the Sauk County Fair only.

GRADE CLASS

Rules for grade classes are exactly the same for registered cattle with the exception of registration paper verification.

BEST BARN EXHIBIT - - Groups keeping their stalls, animals and other properties in the most attractive appearance throughout the fair. All clubs, chapters, and youth organizations are eligible to participate. Judging will take place daily throughout the fair. Points considered in placings:

- A club display and work done by members.
- An attractive exhibit, which indicates club name and exhibit boundaries.
- Care and appearance of animals and equipment.
- Courtesy of club members. Someone present during the day. No unnecessary loitering. (See Behavior Rules)

HERD DAIRY HERD IMPROVEMENT PRODUCTION AWARD

The South Central DHI Milk Testing Cooperative will recognize the highest producing cow in each class of the Junior Fair Dairy show. **PRIOR TO THE SHOW ****** Exhibitors are to submit (ILC) Individual Cow Record, which you can obtain from your field technician, on their animals prior to the show. Records must be a completed record. Records from all type tests (except Profitest) are eligible. Animals of all breeds, registered or grade are eligible, including dry class animals. The highest actual 305 days (or less) pounds of milk produced by a cow in the class will receive the award.

STATE FAIR INFORMATION- Sauk County Fair provides this info as a service, always check with the State Fair for most current info or changes. All animals in the Junior Dairy Dept. two years or older must be registered or transferred on/or before January 1st of the Fair year in the name of the exhibitor. Updated in 2012 (Check WI State Fair Rules for updated information): Co-ownership will be allowed as long as the exhibitor's full name appears on the registration paper along with any other individual under 21 years of age as on January 1st of the current year.

DR. W.I. BIBLE TRAVELING TROPHY (*Person recognized as starting 4-H in Sauk County*) – Open to current showmanship winners and previous Dr. Bible winners. *Sponsored by Former South Lime Ridge 4-H Club members.*

*Previous winners of the Dr. Bible Trophy will be judged on Friday with Senior Division and are eligible for regular showmanship competition in their age category. Trophy should be returned to the fair office the following year. (When an exhibitor wins the Dr. Bible Trophy a 3rd time in their show career, they get to keep the trophy).

- Champions will be awarded in separate Grade & Registered divisions only if ten or more animals are exhibited in that breed, otherwise champions will be combined grade & registered in that breed.
- Any animal that is a Beef/Dairy crossbred must be shown in the Beef/Dairy crossbred Beef Show.
- To be eligible for the dairy show, the animal must be 100% dairy.

AGE CLASSIFICATIONS:

Spring Heifer	Born on or after March 1, of the current Exhibit year: (must be 4 months old day of show).
Winter Calf	Born December 1, year preceding Exhibit Year - February 29, of the current Exhibit year.
Fall Calf	Born September 1 - November 30, year preceding Exhibit Year
Summer Yearling	Born June 1 – Aug 31 st of year preceding Exhibit year.
Spring Yearling	Born March 1 st – May 31 st of year preceding Exhibit year
Winter Yearling	Born Dec. 1 st , of second year preceding the Exhibit year- Feb 29 of year preceding Exhibit year
Fall Yearling	Born September 1 st – November 30, of the second year preceding Exhibit year
Two-Year-Old	Born September 1 st – August 31 st of the third year preceding Exhibit year
Three-Year-Old	Born September 1 st – August 31 st of the fourth year preceding Exhibit year
Four-Year-Old	Born September 1 st – August 31 st of the fifth year preceding Exhibit year
Five-Year-Old plus	Born September 1 st – August 31 st of the sixth year preceding Exhibit year
Dry Cow	Over 2 years old and has milked a minimum of 280 days and is in dry form.

CLASS 13 – BRED & OWNED – By Exhibitor, animal must be in Junior Exhibitors' name, not farm name.

- Bring registration papers to ring verify ownership in exhibitor's name.

CLASS 14 – CLUB HERD (no entry required)

- Mixed or all of one breed – 5 animals minimum to 7 animals maximum – with 3-7 exhibitors.

Premiums: 1st \$3.00, 2nd \$2.50, 3rd \$2.00, 4th \$1.50 Award: Top Dairy Showman

- Must be registered in the online entry to receive premiums & ribbons
- The first and second blue ribbon winning exhibitors from each showmanship class will compete for Top Dairy Showman.
