

DEPARTMENT 35-EDUCATIONAL & SCHOOL EXHIBITS
Superintendent

Judging Fair Monday, 1:30pm to 6:30pm.

Rules & Requirements:

- Open only to approved school groups within Sauk County
- Contact the Sauk County Fair to register starting May 1st and no later than June 1st of the current fair year.
- This department is not for exhibitors registering in any other parts of the Junior or Open Fair.
- This **is not for individual entries** but for schools to register multiple exhibitors.
- Approved schools should have an adult register their group.
- Exhibitors from the school must go to a school district withing Sauk County
- Scrapbooks should have at least 4 and maximum of 10 pages
- Exhibits shall not be displayed in any other department.
- Posters can be no larger than 14" x 22".
- No exhibitor may make more than one entry in any prize number.
- In order for premiums to be paid to the school, a complete list of student exhibitors contributing to the exhibits must be submitted (including addresses). This is required by the state of Wisconsin ATCP 160.

CLASS 1 – SCHOOL BOOTH DISPLAYS ENTRIES

(a) The exhibit shall consist of a school booth display representing the entire school or a subject taught within the school. Each school is limited to one entry under the school booth system. The subject matter for exhibits include any subject taught in the school during the school year.

(b) Judging shall be based on factors such as arrangement, theme, entry, eye appeal, and creativeness.

(c) No state premium aid may be paid on education department premiums unless the fair board files with the department a complete list of exhibitors.

Premiums on school booth displays shall be paid to the school. Premiums of 1ST, \$75.00, 2ND \$70.00, 3RD \$65.00 and 4TH \$60.00.

CLASS 2 – STUDENT GROUP DISPLAYS

Student exhibits shall consist of a student group other than a student group representing the entire school.

The exhibit may not be displayed as part of a school booth exhibit. Exhibits entered under student group displays shall meet all of the following requirements:

1. Include school name, teacher's name, name and address of student, and exhibitor's number on the official entry form.
2. Be entered under the name of the school with participating grades listed on the entry.
3. Be comprised of schoolwork completed during the current school year.

(b) Student group displays shall be judged on originality, creativeness, quality, subject material, art media, individual and group work, attractive arrangement, and percentage of pupils participating.

(c) Premiums on student group displays may be paid to the teacher or to the school.

Premiums (see rules above) 1st , \$12.00; 2nd \$10.00; 3rd , \$8.00; 4th , \$6.00

CLASS 3 – INDIVIDUAL STUDENT ENTRIES

The exhibit is entered by an individual student, including special education students. The exhibit may not be displayed as part of a school booth exhibit or a student group display. Specific classes for individual competition for all grade levels may be selected by the fair board. Individual students may enter only one exhibit in each class. Exhibits entered under an individual shall meet all of the following requirements:

1. Include school name, teacher's name, name and address of student, and exhibitor's number on the official entry form.
2. List all entries on one official entry blank.
3. Be comprised of schoolwork completed during the current school year.

(b) Premiums on individual student exhibits are paid to the individual exhibitor. Premiums of \$1.75, \$1.50, \$1.25 and \$1.00.
