

How To: Static Non-Animal Judging

When: Monday, July 6th from 1:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m.

- 1) Start the day by entering the South side of the Commercial Building and checking in at the front table
 - a) This is where you will get project entry cards, back tags, orders of parking passes & any T-Shirts ordered.
- 2) Then move to a designated tables along the South wall where you will attach your entry tags to your projects.
 - a) The entry tags will have your name, the department, class, lot & description of the exhibit.
 - b) Fairbooks will be available, make sure you follow any specific department directions for placement of your tag (especially photography)
 - c) There will be supplies (hole punches, string, tape, etc. available to do this)

- 3) Once your preparation has been completed, volunteers will direct you to the location of your departments around the building
- 4) You will wait in that department's chair line for your turn to be judged.
 - a) If you have multiple projects in one department, you will show them **all together** to the same department judge (each exhibit is judged and placed)
- 5) Once you have completed showing your exhibit(s), take them to the superintendent (located next to the judges) to have the placing(s) recorded.
 - a) It is extremely important to get your placing recorded, or no premium will be paid.
 - b) If you receive a placing , you will get your exhibit back, if it is starred it will stay for further judging later and will be taken to the exhibit buildings later.
- 6) After showing one or all of your exhibit(s), you will be responsible for taking them to the proper Project/Exhibit Building located north of the Commercial Building
 - a) Watch for Signage; Project/Exhibit Building 3 will house most of the exhibits, there will be Sauk County 4-H volunteers at the Exhibit Buildings to help you locate where your project/exhibit needs to go



- Things to remember:
 - Certain food exhibits do not stay at the fairgrounds during fair

- To showcase your hard work, a Sauk County 4-H staff member will take a picture with you and your project to be displayed in project building 2
- Baked goods that stay in the building will be sprayed with hairspray to help preserve them before being placed in building 2
- Exhibitors with fragile or valuable items may choose to take them home if they are concerned about potential damage. Before leaving, exhibitors must take a photo of the item to be displayed in its place.”
- Be patient as there are many things to be judged, wait your turn in the seats and listen to the direction of the superintendents while at their station
- Remember to breathe and be proud of your hard work!
 - The judge is excited to see what you have put together, show it off with pride
